A: Hospice provides comfort-focused care for people in the final stage of a serious illness. It prioritizes quality of life over curative treatment.

Q: What does hospice include?

A: A team of nurses, doctors, aides, social workers, and chaplains who manage symptoms and provide emotional, spiritual, and practical support for both patients and families.

Q: Where is hospice care provided?

A: Wherever your loved one is most comfortable, be it home, a nursing facility, an assisted living, or a hospital.

Q: Will my loved one still receive medical care?

A: Yes, care will be focused on comfort through managing pain, breathing, and other symptoms.

Q: Is hospice covered by insurance?

A: Hospice is typically covered by Medicare, Medicaid, and most private insurance plans.

Q: When should we consider hospice?

A: When treatments are no longer helping and the focus shifts to comfort and quality of life.
